DEA’s financial officials requested treasury approval for the shortfall, however Treasury did not approve the request. None of DEA’s internal processes does not allow for the money to be directly transferred to NDM; within the PFMA requirements.</p>	<p>Mr. J. Draft National Coastal Access By-Law

- Following the PCC meeting of 12 July 2018, the decision at the WG 8 meeting was that, available by-laws, from other coastal municipalities in South Africa provide sufficient guidance to municipalities. At this stage there is thus no need to develop a national coastal access model by-law to assist municipalities. DENC, Coastal Management to facilitate sessions with municipalities to discuss the available by-laws with coastal municipalities before the 2018/19 financial year.

The by-laws of other coastal municipalities were sent to the Northern Cape municipalities on 06 December 2018. In preparation for the workshop DENC requested information from municipalities on what specific aspects they need guidance with as to prepare accordingly. Municipalities also need to indicate their capacity and resources to enforce by-laws.

Municipalities did not respond to date

Ms. Njemla provided the information on coastal and sea concessions including right holders, area and validity/timespan of mining rights. The information is however not in, shapefile (GIS), the format that is required.

The MEC decided that DMR must provide the information in the required format.
