The following provision, still contained within the ToR (Section 8), covers the deleted provision "The MEC may terminate membership of the member of the Provincial Coastal Committee where: He or she fails to perform the duties as a member of the Provincial Coastal Committee".				
Section 9. Responsibilities of Members 9.4 All member institutions will have a single vote at committee meetings.				
It was recommended that this provision be removed.				
After consideration of other sections in the PCC ToR that makes reference to voting; removal of the recommendation needs to be reconsidered. A provision might need to be included that informs PCC members beforehand that voting will take place including the matters that is going to be voted on.				
For example Section 10.14 states that "A recommendation for the dissolution of the NC PCC shall be made to the MEC if two-thirds of all members present at a meeting vote in favour of such dissolution."				

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10.10 Quorum (i) The quorum for a meeting will be 50% of the total number of members of the NC PCC, plus one. If the Secretariat is aware, 3 days prior to the meeting, that there will not be a quorum, the members of the NC PCC should be informed in writing, and the Chairperson can postpone the meeting."				
It is recommended that the provision be removed from the ToR. There are members that are very committed to attending PCC meetings; and travel from afar. A long standing discussion point on the PCC agenda is the ill attendance of certain roleplayers. A few role players not attending the PCC meeting should not be allowed to hamper the purpose of the PCC meeting.

<u>Funding shortfall for Swartlintjies and Buffels</u> Estuary Management Plans

The funding shortfall have been approved within DEA's budget. As explained in previous PCC meetings, Mr. Peter reiterated the challenges DEA experienced to transfer the funds to NDM, since the MoU with Nelson Mandela University lapsed. DEA's financial officials requested treasury approval for the shortfall, however Treasury did not approve the request. None of DEA's internal processes does not allow for the money to be directly transferred to NDM; within the PFMA requirements.

The funds have not yet been paid to NDM.

The MEC was clear that the issue needed to be addressed as the shortfall have been approved. A meeting was suggested between the CFO's of both NDM and DEA.

Feedback 31 August 2020

On 27 February the pollution directorate responded as follows:

In terms of section 69 of the National Environmental Management Act: Integrated Coastal Management Act, 2008(Act No.24 of 2008) which states (1) "no person may discharge effluent that originates from a source on land into coastal except in terms of a general discharge authorisation contemplated in subsection(2) or a coastal waters discharge permit issued under this section by the Minister after consultation with the Minister responsible for water affairs in instances of discharge of effluent in an estuary"

In the absence of General Discharge Authorisation Regulations the facility must apply for a coastal water discharge permit in terms of section 69(3) of the National Environmental Management: Integrated Coastal Management Act (Act 24 of 2008) which states "any person who wishes to discharge effluent into coastal waters in circumstances that are not authorised under a general discharge authorisation in subsection (2) must apply to the Department for a coastal waters discharge permit".

The GDA has not been promulgated and the regulations that are promulgated are the Coastal water Discharge permit Regulations that require any person discharging to the coastal waters to apply for a coastal water discharge permit.
